About the OEPA

The Ontario Engineering Project Awards (OEPA) is dedicated to celebrating excellence within the consulting engineering profession. We honour projects from all ACEC-Ontario member firms, regardless of size or budget. Whether your company has 5, 50, or 500 employees, and whether your project was valued at \$10,000 or \$100,000,000, if it's innovative or impactful, it deserves recognition.

ACEC-Ontario is committed to evolving the awards program and its categories, guided by feedback from jury and members. Our goal is to reduce barriers to entry and recognize a broader range of firms.

New this year, we have moved the submission process completely online, allowing you to upload your files and enter information directly on the platform, providing a seamless and user-friendly experience for our members.

The OEPA program celebrates the impact ACEC-Ontario member companies have on their clients and society, and honour those who have demonstrated outstanding efforts over the past two years and culminates in a gala event, were the industry comes together in ceremony to celebrate and network.

We invite our member firms to showcase their exceptional projects by entering the 2026 OEPA program. This is your opportunity to shine a spotlight on your hard work and innovation. Winners will be revealed at the prestigious OEPA Gala on May 7, 2026, where their projects will be highlighted in professional videos for company use. Additionally, winners will be publicly announced via press release and social media, amplifying their achievements to a broader audience.

It highlights your firm's innovative solutions and successful outcomes to a wider professional audience, potentially attracting new clients and partners.

Who We Are

Founded in 1975, the Association of Consulting Engineering Companies – Ontario (ACEC-Ontario) is the organization that represents engineering companies across the province. We promote the business interests of our 140 member firms, who employ 29,000 Ontarians. The work of our members supports Ontario's economic growth and improves the quality of life of communities across the province.

We offer value through advocacy efforts, learning and networking opportunities, along with cost savings programs. Annually, we host the Ontario Engineering Project Awards, our flag-ship event, that celebrates the work of our member firms.

Award Categories

The OEPA aspires to celebrate the consulting engineering profession by honouring all projects submitted to the program by ACEC-Ontario member firms. The OEPA categories were designed to recognize consulting engineering excellence and award ACEC-Ontario member companies who put forth the strongest efforts over the year. The breakdown of the categories is described below.

The Willis Chipman Award

The Willis Chipman award, named after the first engineer in Canada, who pioneered the industry in Ontario, grants the highest honour. It is awarded to the project that best demonstrates the value and importance of consulting engineering plays to improve the economic, social and environmental quality of life in Ontario. The Willis Chipman award is the most prestigious award and given independently, with no extra submission required.

Sustainable Development Impact Award

The Sustainable Award recognizes the project that best demonstrates the three pillars of sustainable development: society, environment, and economy. The project must support the goals of society and incorporate environmental sustainability elements, while strengthening economic development in Ontario or beyond. Like Willis Chipman, this award is given independently from the category in which it was submitted in, no extra submission is required.

Examples of projects that would be eligible are EV infrastructure projects, conservation research and initiatives, water/wastewater conservation and innovation, public transport, etc.

Small Firm, Big Impact Award

The Small Firm, Big Impact award, recognizes the significant impact and importance of the work our smaller companies do. There will be two categories presented for this award, firms with 1-49 total staff and firms with 50-99 total staff.

We understand that our member firms, which are smaller in size, may not have teams to support complex project submissions. With this in mind, we have created a simplified and condensed submission entry form covering the most important details: the project objective, how you addressed it, and the results. Please be sure to submit at least three project images. You may attach additional project information you would like the judges to review but it should be no longer than 2-3 pages.

Internal Innovation Award

Innovation doesn't always mean new technology—it can mean new ways of thinking, working, and growing together. This special award category celebrates the consulting engineering industry—its people and the meaningful impact their work has on the community. If your team or firm has gone above and beyond to foster a strong internal culture, support employee retention through thoughtful practices, or drive internal innovation, we encourage you to apply and inspire others in this competitive industry.

Examples: Education debt repayment support program, flexible working arrangements dependent on member company staff needs.

People First Award

Community engagement and philanthropy go hand in hand with the work of engineers whose impact extends beyond infrastructure into the lives of those around them. This award recognizes projects or firms that have made a meaningful difference at the local level. No initiative is too small as impact isn't always measurable, but it's always felt.

Eligible initiatives include any charity or community activity that benefits Ontarians—from fundraising efforts to hands-on involvement in environmental or social causes.

Examples: a staff-led community games night supporting cancer patients, or a treeplanting event along a local watershed.

Awards of Distinction

The Awards of Distinction may be presented to up to 10 outstanding projects. These can include, but are not limited to, initiatives in:

• Industrial, commercial, institutional buildings/building science includes all engineering projects related to industrial/commercial/institutional buildings electrical, mechanical, structural, foundations, acoustics, ergonomics, fire protection/prevention, preliminary/final design, repair/restoration, roofing and

waterproofing, walls and cladding, and heating systems including transportation terminals and service centers.

- **Environment** includes all engineering projects related to air quality management, environmental assessments, groundwater resources/hydrogeology, noise and vibration, solid/hazardous waste management, and surface water resources.
- Municipal infrastructure includes all engineering projects related to the conveyance of drinking water, sanitary and storm sewage, combined sewage, and related infrastructure including stormwater management, Low Impact Development techniques, and CSO storage and treatment.
- Industry, energy and resources include all engineering projects related to agriculture, fisheries, forestry, electrical power generation, geophysics, geotechnical, mining, metallurgy, oil and gas production/storage, petrochemical, solar energy, steam power generation and wind energy.
- Project management includes all engineering projects related to construction management, construction quality control, contact administration, management of design, procurement management, project control and risk management, related management services, and value engineering.
- **Studies and research** include all engineering projects related to planning and feasibility studies.
- **Transit / transportation** includes all traffic engineering and control, transportation planning, urban public transit, active transportation, airports, roads, bridges and highways, rail, pavement design and ports and harbors.
- Housing, community and sustainability includes all refurbishment of older housing and community buildings/structures. Evidence to advantages of refurbishments/enhanced technologies upgrades, rather than demolition or deterioration, proving to reduce carbon footprint or providing a social benefit to reducing energy use in the built environment exists.

Jury's Choice Awards

Upon the jury's discretion, they may choose to introduce additional award categories if they find merit in recognizing a project that falls outside the listed categories but demonstrates exceptional impact. In past years, such special recognitions have included areas like humanitarian efforts, climate resilience, and carbon impact.

OEPA Selection Process

Our Jury is comprised of seasoned qualified professionals representing leading associations, client groups and academia in the industry who are not currently engaged in the consulting practice. The jury volunteers their time and expertise to examine each project and determine the winners of each award category. Projects are reviewed independently and deliberated upon collectively.

Projects are evaluated based on the four criteria listed below. Details are provided under the Executive Summary of the Specifications section of this document.

The OEPA Jury is an independent group. They participate in the OEPA by lending their skills and knowledge to select the award winners, playing an important role in recognizing the significance of the consulting engineering profession.

Rules of Eligibility

pai	e OEPA has implemented rules of eligibility to create a fair and orderly program for its articipants. Please ensure your entry meets the following requirements: Only ACEC-Ontario member companies are eligible to enter the OEPA program by entering a project submission their company has worked on. Joint submissions between ACEC-Ontario member firms are acceptable. Joint submissions involving non-ACEC-Ontario members are acceptable only if the ACEC-Ontario member companies(s) did more than 50 per cent of the work and submit it in their name. Company size will be based on the combined number of employees for joint submissions.	
	☐ Company size is based on the number of employees in Ontario that was provided by your firm during your 2025-2026 renewal process.	
	☐ A member company may submit a maximum of five entries per year, including joint submissions.	
	 Project completion: Projects entered must have been completed to the owner/client's satisfaction in the period from September 30, 2023, to September 30, 2025. Completed design portions may be submitted, even if the project's still undergoing construction, if the owner/client of the project approves its submission. Project was completed within budget. 	
	Projects outside of Ontario are eligible for the Awards of Distinction provided that they have been managed out of an office in Ontario.

Example: The National Capital Commission retained ABC Consulting to develop an innovative signalization layout to provide pedestrians and cyclists a safe crossing to the Rideau Canal and downtown area. High speeds and large traffic volumes made crossing difficult and potentially dangerous without a creative crossing solution. The configuration

uses new features to improve the safety and connectivity of the crossing for active transportation users at this important node, creating an increase in cycling and pedestrian usage.

<u>Project Details (up to 4 pages) - To be uploaded as .pdf (Not required for Internal Innovation and People First Award)</u>

The project details report should be a detailed report expanding on the 130-word summary submitted and include the bolded headings below. The Jury will be scoring projects based on the detailed items below. Each criterion may not be applicable to every project and is a guideline for information that should be included where possible. Please note font size to be no less than 10.5 pt.

- Solutions that were applied to meet the objectives
- Project management used to complete the project
- Project impact on the community
- Outstanding engineering achievements
